



I think we can all agree that test pilots are pretty tough cookies. Now imagine one particular test pilot whose assignment was to fly toward hydrogen bomb explosions during Operation Redwing. That's the story of Bud Evans in his book <u>A Tenth of a Second to Live</u>. A Korean war veteran as well, this book focuses on his F-84F flights over Eniwetok and Bikini Atolls in 1956. Bud talks in detail about the flight, the shots and the sheer boredom living in the middle of the Pacific on Eniwetok for six months. Perhaps the creepiest tidbit he shares is about seeing the x-ray-like bone structure in his hand during the blasts.

While Bud did encounter health issues after the program, I'm glad he's around in 2018 to share his story and recently declassified information.

And for the X-2 followers out there, pick up a copy as Bud talks a bit about his friend Mel Apt.






Flight Test Book Club: The X-15 Rocket Plane, Flying the First Wings Into Space


